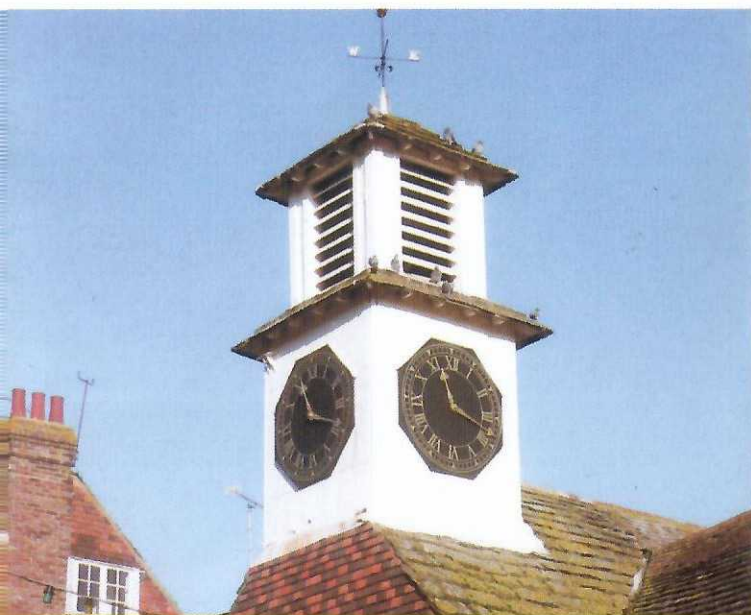


SUPPORTING STEYNING

Oak posts have been here since the 19th century when cattle were tied to them for the High Street market. A few years ago the Society paid for the complete cost of replacement.



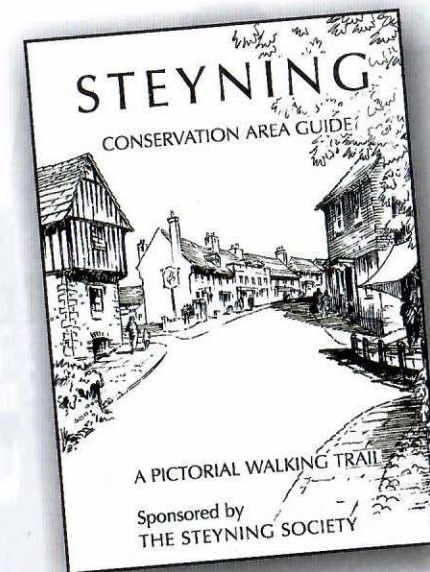

SOUTH DOWNS NATIONAL PARK

The South Downs National Park boundary is only 300 metres from the centre of the town and there are a number of ways up to the Downs. The Steyning Society supported the creation of the National Park to preserve this fine countryside on our doorstep.

ACTIVITIES FOR MEMBERS

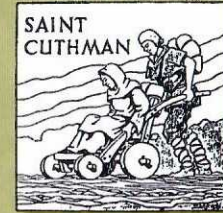
